He wasn't fond of aircraft or boats so every other summer we traveled across country on the mother road and various other asphalt paths putting on as many miles as possible at \$0.22 per gal.

Over the years I have owned a number of marks. These included a Corvair Monza, TR4, Austin Healy Sprite, several VW's (bugs and buses), 55' Thunderbird, an early Alfa Spyder, Fiat 124 Sport Coupe, Fiat Spyder, Morgan +4, VW Jetta and a 1966 Jaguar XKE Coupe. Now we are an all wagon family, on the mainland, consisting of a Subaru Outback, Volvo V70 and a 1948 Packard 'woody' station wagon. In Hawaii we still have the VW Jetta and a 1973 GMC 1 Ton Camper Special.
