RFCC = Charlie Budenz: RFCC was properly introduced to me by long time personal friends of my parents, the professional portrait photographer "Derek Green" of London and his accomplished assistant/wife Peggy. This perfectly matched pair of artists had taken our family portraits for many years, and as I approached driving age, I greatly admired his BRG Jag 3.8 sedan with chrome wire wheels.

During my college years I discovered that drag racing was *a draaag!!* After all, why would anyone spend more time and money to be on the track for less time? I preferred the skills of steering, throttle, shifting and braking to just straight line performance.

After 3 Navy deployments to Vietnam (69-70-71), I returned to RFCC with a baby blue '68 Fiat 124 Spyder as well as a red '69 coupe. At that time there was sizeable Fiat contingent in the club. Those who also owned Fiat 124 models included Bob and Mary Ann Stewart, "Rerun" Leland Lowe as well as Tom and Gloria Cole. Also in the contingent were Dallas and Anne Dengate with their "Snoopy" Abarth 600, plus Gene Wood's Fiat X1/9 (after his Porsche 912 coupe).

A key appealing element regarding RFCC was the friendly rivalries caused by being a multi-marque club. The Italian owners were pitted against the British invasion represented by several "Mini" owners including Ralph Covell. Ken Bertino and the drivers of Buffalo Foonman Racing, Bill Robinson and Bruce Dingman plus their racing mechanic Ron Jones. Of course the Jag contingent included Prez Green and Bill Robinson.

Then there was "Gramps" in his screaming red Mercedes 190SL.

Back then the RFCC was a full-service club with rallies, concours, parking lot slaloms and real road races out at the extremely real Riverside International Raceway. The club gained access by volunteering as ticket takers at the raceway's professional events or ingratiating ourselves by being other "odd jobs" wherever we could. Certainly worthy of entry to the cool racer parties at the Mission Inn. I doubt if my then-wife, Sherie, will ever forget meeting Paul Newman!!

We had a totally fun group of folks who switched off taking tickets at the press gate, main gate or back gate, including Bob and Esther Whittaker, Fred and Lucy Eden, as well as Mike and Michelle Richman.

Many RFCC traditions were initiated during those years, ranging from ever classic "Chili Cook-offs" by the Whittaker's, slaloms at UCR arranged by Paula Southard, the Robinson's "Vino Rally" and the Ladies "Cherchez" Rallies. "Beaucoup" GOOD TIMES....

Perhaps the club grew too big too fast, or just that it could take over all of your social life, regardless, it morphed into several separate factions, rallyists, road racers and those that spanned the gaps.

For myself, I grew into road racing from slaloms by first sharing a "school" car for Solo I with Gene Wood, then a SCCA regional car with Leland Lowe, all in Fiat 124 Spydery. Because those were the cars and the parts we had. Highly valued lifelong friendships resulted from these affiliations. Later, I purchased an SCCA National level "GP" Fiat 124 Spyder which I successfully campaigned for several seasons, with many class wins.
